THE GIFT OF LIFE CMH saves the life of an unresponsive baby

After an unexpected labor and delivery of their newborn baby, a local family quickly realized that their child was unresponsive, and they needed to seek help quickly. When Clinch Memorial Hospital's Emergency Room staff heard the call announcing the unresponsive baby was on her way, they were prepared. She was dead on arrival when the EMTs rushed her in, and the ER staff initiated a code immediately.

The baby was intubated within four minutes and with a return of spontaneous circulation (ROSC) was achieved within 11 minutes after the child was rushed through the doors of Clinch Memorial's emergency room. Within the hour, the baby had been revived and began to show positive signs (rooting, kicking her feet, and death grips on fingers with both hands) prior to her departure to a larger children's hospital in Jacksonville.

"In summary, the staff took an impossible situation (an infant who was down for approximately 10-15 minutes upon birth) and made a miracle," said a CMH Nurse. "Our heartfelt thanks and admiration go out to the crew who saved a life and reunited a family."

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"I am so incredibly proud of our medical staff for the role they played in saving this baby's life," said CEO, Angela Ammons. "This is a true testament to the importance of rural hospitals. Without Clinch Memorial, the family would have had to travel at least 30 minutes to reach the closest hospital. That time is crucial in a situation like this, it could have changed the outcome."



"I've had open heart surgery, kidney transplant, colon cancer surgery, and I'm a diabetic. I have been coming to pulmonary rehab for several months, and it is the best thing I have ever done. The people here are great. Before, I could only take ten steps then I had to stop and prop up on something. Now, I can walk and walk without any problems. My breathing is great. I recommend this program to people daily."

As I waited to be invited back to ER I noted the same manner (kind clear directions and full assistance) was provided each person who entered. The pharmacy qualifies for the 340B The Clinch Memorial Pharmacy is located inside of the hospital's facility and serves Clinch County and surrounding communities. Anyone can fulfill their prescriptions at Clinch Memorial Pharmacy, regardless of if they are a patient at Clinch Memorial Hospital or not.

Drug Pricing Program. This program requires drug manufacturers to sell outpatient drugs at a discount to safetynet providers, such as CMH. For example, the same 10 ml vial of insulin that normally sells for about \$350 costs just \$2 to \$25 through the 340b program at Clinch Memorial for qualifying patients. Clinch Memorial Pharmacy also provides Meds-to-Beds services, a free service that offers education about medication and delivers prescriptions to patients. Inpatients and Emergency Room patients have the convenience of receiving their prescriptions before they leave the hospital.

PARAIVIEDICINE Home Based Healthcare Coming Soon

The Southwest Georgia Area Health Education Center (SOWEGA-AHEC) has been awarded \$1.3 million in grant funding from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) and Health **Resources and Services** Administration (HRSA). Nearly \$46 million was awarded to 31 organizations to support the Rural Public Health Workforce Training Network Program over the next three years. "Among the most important steps we can take to improve access to health care in rural communities is to invest in growing the rural health care workforce," said HRSA Administrator Carole Johnson in the HHS Press Release. Through AHEC's Recruit, Train, and Retain pipeline model, the Rural Public Health Workforce Training Network Program will create an innovative new approach for accomplishing AHEC's pipeline initiatives. The \$1.3 million grant will be used to

develop and implement the Southwest Georgia Community Paramedicine Program to address how limited access to primary care causes higher ER visits and readmissions of chronic and nonemergent patients. A network of rural hospitals will develop a CP Workforce Training Program to cross-train five EMS providers to work in five newly established hospital-based CP departments to reduce non-emergent ER visits through at-home education and access to needed resources. Clinch Memorial Hospital is one of the Southwest Georgia Community Paramedicine Network members and a recipient of the grant. CMH is excited to implement the Paramedicine Program in 2023! Clinch Memorial will recruit and select 25 patients to participate in the program every six months. The Paramedicine employee will perform routine visits to each of the patient's homes to ensure their medical needs are being met. This is not an emergency medical service.

Georgia Grown & Employee Wellness

The COVID-19 pandemic highlighted many opportunities to "fix" a broken system. With supply chain issues affecting the food supply and local farmer's ability to export food, the need for shopping local was apparent. At this time, CMH made it a priority to purchase locally produced food for its employees and customers at the Daily Bread Cafe. This goal revolutionized CMH's Farm to Table initiative. Through a partnership with Retaaza, CMH has received fresh, Georgia Grown produce used in the cafeteria and donated to employees as an employee benefit, wellness initiative, and a way to support local farmers. With funding from an HFFI Grant, Clinch Memorial and Retaaza will launch a mobile food market in 2023 to provide fresh produce at little to no cost. The program aims to make food more accessible in underserved and high-need areas where families with limited financial and transportation resources may not be able to access food through traditional grocery stores.

Clinch County FFA's Hog Show

The Clinch County FFA held its first hog show in decades during the spring semester of 2022! After months of feeding and preparing the hogs for the county show, the students at CCMS/CCHS had a great turn out. At the second show this November, Tony Walsh, Director of Facilities, represented CMH at the Hog Show and purchased Madeline Bennett's hog. Employees enjoyed Madeline's Hog at the 2022 Annual Christmas Dinner and Braxton Harris' Hog from the first show at the CMH 14 Homecoming Lunch in March!

GEORGIA HAS A HEART FOR CLINCH MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

Since its inception in 2017, Clinch Memorial has received \$1.6 million from generous Georgians who donated to the HEART program, a rural hospital tax credit. This opportunity is made available through legislation that enables Georgia taxpayers to receive a state income tax credit for 100% of the amount they contribute to qualified hospital organizations. These funds are then reinvested into the facilities to enhance patient access and care.
